# Robotics

The Robotics Lab propels learners into the innovative realm of technology, fostering innovation and problem-solving skills. Students get to apply science theories to practical applications through hands-on projects.

Students of Class IV explored the concept of pulleys in the Robotics Lab and practically applied their knowledge by creating a functional Pulley Flag. They discovered how this simple yet ingenious machine reduces effort in lifting objects and changes the direction of force. By using a motorized pulley system, they enhanced their understanding of automation in modern machinery.

Students of Class V learnt to design and create a functional Kicker in the Robotics Lab by applying concepts of mechanics and automation. Kicker is a machine used in various industries to push heavy objects efficiently. It is also used in sports like football and hockey to kick or strike objects.

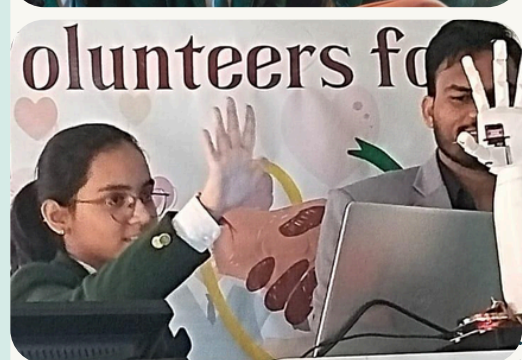
Students of Classes VI and VII designed and built a model of a Ploughing Machine in the Robotics Lab, and explored its functionality and significance in modern agriculture. Ploughing is the process of loosening and turning the soil, an essential step in agriculture performed before sowing seeds.

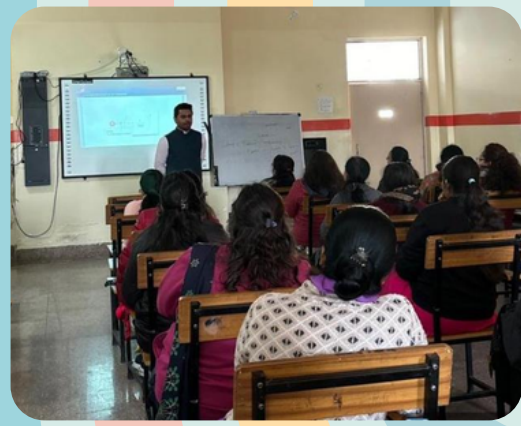

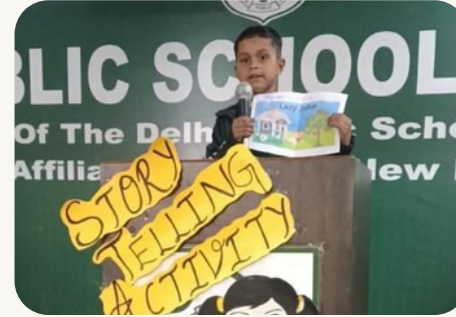


# Maha Shivratri Celebrations
